## To examine additional pathway(s) for general pastoral 3

colloguy for members of LCMS congregations who have 4

- graduated with an accredited Master of Divinity Degree from a 5
- Non-LCMS Seminary. 6

8 WHEREAS, God's Word calls us to pray for additional workers in the harvest, "When he (Jesus) saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they 9 were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his 10

- disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray 11
- earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest;" 12
- (Matthew 9:36-37, ESV); and 13
- 14

WHEREAS, two thousand pastors of the Lutheran Church-Missouri 15

Synod are expected to retire in the next ten years and the synod currently 16

has 476 pastoral vacancies, and the entire graduating class of both 17

seminaries was eighty-eight in 2022 to replace these faithful servants and 18

- 19 expand further mission and ministry; and

21 WHEREAS, the congregations of the California-Nevada-Hawaii District - LCMS

give thanks to God and celebrate the various alternate routes to ordination and 22

pastoral ministry available in the LCMS, such as Specific Ministry Pastors (SMP), 23

there is a growing need for general ordination pastors who are able to receive 24 divine calls from congregations without restriction, provide supervision for other 25

rostered church workers, supervise vicars, hold elected or appointed office on the 26

district or national Synod level such as a Circuit Visitor, and vote as delegates at 27

the Synodical conventions of the church; and

30 WHEREAS, there are pathways by which pastors, from church bodies outside the

Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, who meet specific criteria may secure 31

admission to the ministerium of LCMS as general ordination pastors through 32

Colloguy. This admission may be provided through a "colloguy" (discussion, 33

interview) with the Colloquy Committee for the Pastoral Ministry; and 34

WHEREAS, The Policy Manual for Admission to the Pastoral Ministry of The 36

Lutheran Church- Missouri Synod by Colloquy: Bylaws and Policies states that 37

applicants for Colloguy must fit into one of two categories (the Colloguy 38

- 39 Committee for the Pastoral Ministry is responsible for the final determination of
- 40 the category in each individual situation):
- 41
- Active Pastors from Other Christian Church Bodies: Men who, at the time of
  application are in good standing and in active service as pastors in another
  Christian Church body/denomination may apply for colloguy.
- 45

Men who have prepared for pastoral ministry but, at the time of application, 46 • 47 are not in active service as pastors: Such applicants must be graduates of a program of study that leads to ordination, from an accredited institution, with 48 no fewer than 60 semester hours (90 quarter hours) of required academic 49 credit. Applicants with prior pastoral service must provide the date (month 50 and year) and the reason (e.g. retirement, resignation, dismissal) their active 51 52 service ended. Such an applicant also must have been a communicant member in good standing in a congregation of The Lutheran Church-53 Missouri Synod for at least two years immediately prior to the time of 54 application. This category does not apply to LCMS members who while 55 members of LCMS congregations have obtained Master of Divinity degrees 56 outside the LCMS; and 57

59 WHEREAS, the colloquy committee has shown discernment over the years, recognizing 60 that qualified men may not fit into the current policy manual categories

61 WHEREAS, Men who have been long-time members in good standing in

62 congregations of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, but are graduates of

- <sup>63</sup> programs of study leading to ordination from an accredited institution outside the
- 64 Lutheran Church-Missouri (meeting all necessary academic credit requirements),
- are not afforded he same opportunity to apply for Colloquy, but must enroll in the
  Residential Alternative Route Program (requiring a two year residential
- Residential Alternative Route Program (requiring a two year residential
  academic program at one of our two seminaries and a one year vicarage) before
- becoming a general ordination pastor in the LCMS; therefore be it

70 RESOLVED, that the California-Nevada-Hawaii District memorialize the 2023

LCMS Convention to examine additional routes for colloquy including online,

72 hybrid, and routes for members in good standing in LCMS congregations who have

- 73 graduated from programs of study leading to ordination from outside the
- seminaries of the LCMS (satisfying all the necessary academic credit
- requirements) to become general ordination pastors by way of the Colloquy

process, without enrolling in the Residential Alternative Route Program.
